Philippians 3:20-21

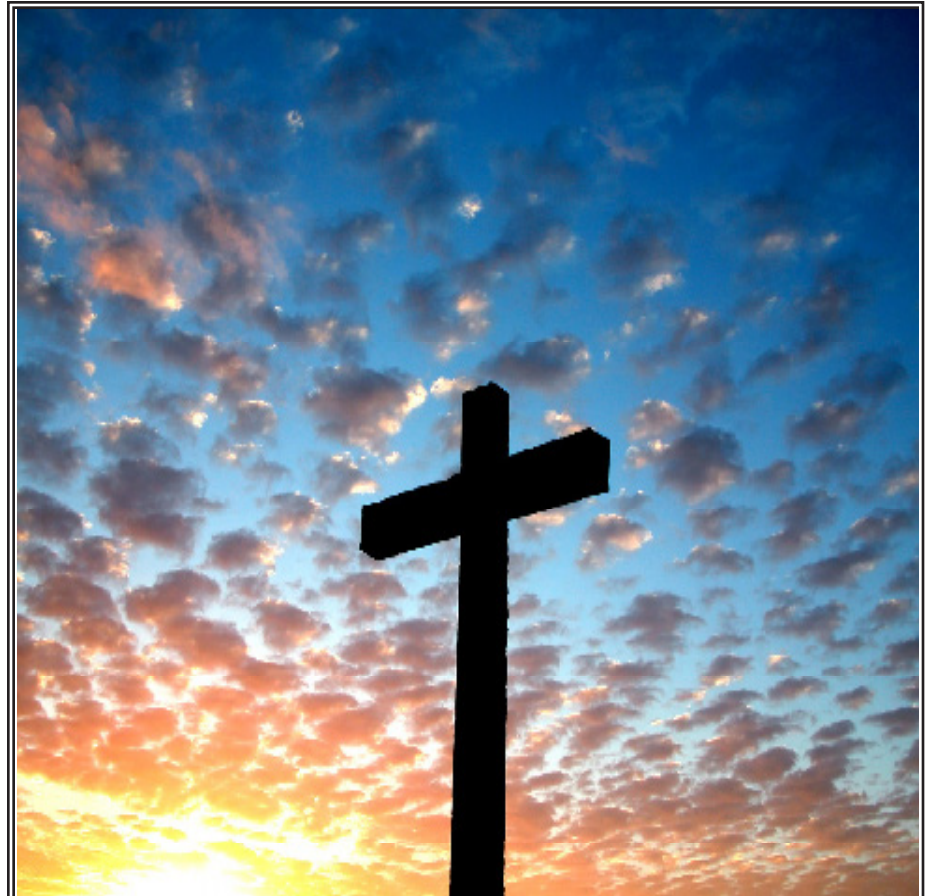
We might laugh about aliens from outer space, but we are very concerned about illegal aliens from other countries. Many U.S. citizens do not want people entering the country without the proper permits and visas. Often it is because we do not want other people to benefit from government welfare programs unless they are legally entitled to them.

The apostle Paul calls us aliens on earth, trespassing on God's turf in our selfishness and sin. It is in God's power to deport us. Instead, God redeems us, gives us a citizenship that we cannot earn and we do not deserve, a citizenship in heaven by faith in Jesus Christ.

The benefit of that citizenship is a transformation that we cannot possibly imagine, the transformation of our physical body into the likeness of His glorious being. We cannot vote about it, enact a law to accomplish it, call a legislative session into being to discuss it. God gives this citizenship in the gift of faith by the power of the Holy Spirit. We have this citizenship in heaven by the loving grace of God that gives us the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.

O Lord, You have made us Your own, Your holy nation, citizens of Your heavenly home. We thank You and praise You. Amen.
