Our first memories are often connected with our mother. It was she in whose presence we felt safe and comforted. Her hug could cure most ills. Her singing voice assured us of her presence and made our lives music. All was well.

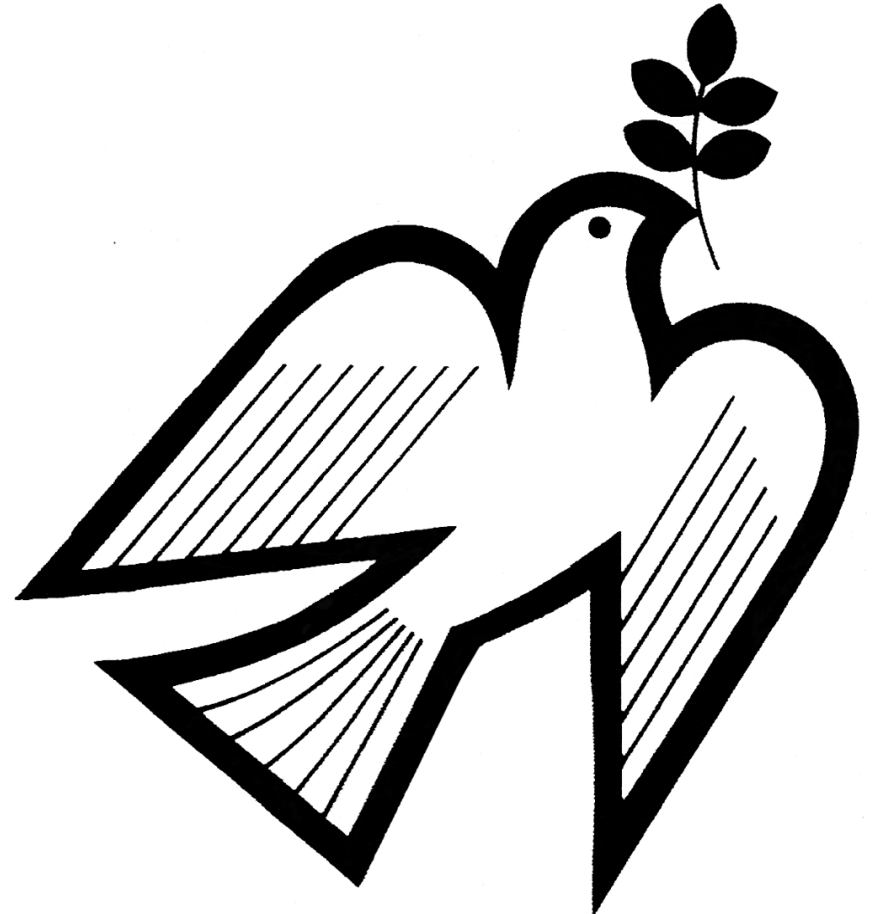
