Jesus, the Word Made Flesh

"Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path." Psalm 119:105

Every time I read this verse, I can't help but hear the song "Thy Word" made popular by Amy Grant. And what I see in my mind's eye is a group of seventh and eighth graders singing that song in the sanctuary of our church. It takes a lot to get seventh and eighth graders excited, but these kids were.

The next time I had them for religion class, I asked them what this psalm meant to them. And they were excited all over again. Singing the song made the psalm alive for them. They were excited about realizing that God's Word is there to guide and protect them in the darkness of our sinful world. God's Word eased their fear.

Have you ever been caught in an unfamiliar room with absolutely no light? Trying to get through a host's home with no light, unaware of the furniture arrangements and doorways, and not knowing even where the light switches are, is an unsettling experience. The first time you bump your shin on a coffee table, you freeze and stand there fearful of moving because you don't know what to expect next. And then your host comes downstairs, switches on the light, and a wave of relief comes over you.

Jesus is God's Word made flesh. Before He came, we were stumbling around in the darkness of our sin, fearful, not knowing what to expect next. But in His light, we see our path. Our path, because of Christ's light shining before us, is to everlasting life in heaven. Sometimes we still stumble and hurt ourselves, but He is there to pick us up and put us back on the path.

Lord Jesus, light of the world, I praise You for Your guidance and strength. Shine on me today as I walk a straight path in Your righteousness. Amen.
