The Best Dressed

"Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them together in perfect unity."
Colossians 3:12-14

"Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing" (Luke 23:34). "Forgive as the Lord forgave you" (Colossians 3:13). "Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors" (Matthew 6:12). These sentences can sear one's heart. Have you ever encountered a situation where you thought you could not forgive another person? If you pick up any newspaper, listen to talk radio, or watch television news, you can readily see and hear examples of sin. In so many cases, the sin is against children and our heart hurts.

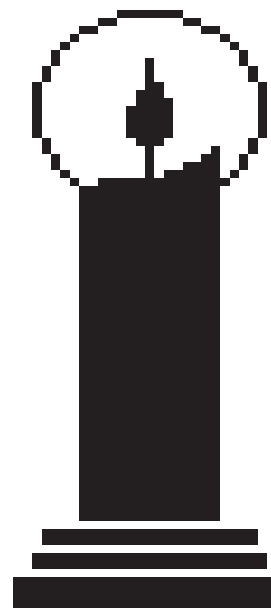
